PERFORMING ARTS TRANSFER, THEATRE: PERFORMANCE BA -ASSOCIATE IN ARTS (RIC)

This program constitutes a JAA transfer program to RIC. Students completing a JAA plan receive an Associate's degree and enter the receiving institution with 60 credits and Junior status. Students must complete all requirements as given. Depending on GPA, students receive a tuition discount of up to 30% at the receiving institution, a waived application fee, and personalized advising.

The CCRI Theatre Performance JAA prepares you to pursue a fouryear bachelor's degree while developing the skills and tools needed to become a lifelong artist for the stage, screen, and beyond. You will receive training in acting, movement, and theatrical makeup, while applying these techniques to a diverse range of materials on stage and in the classroom. This program lays a foundation for continued academic study and professional success in the performing arts.

Program Learning Outcomes

- Create written work that develops and expresses ideas and that addresses a given context and target audience.
- 2. Communicate effectively via oral presentations, performances, participation in group work, and visual presentations.
